This book provides links to the top veteran-based websites for seniors, covering everything from benefits and careers to education and health care.

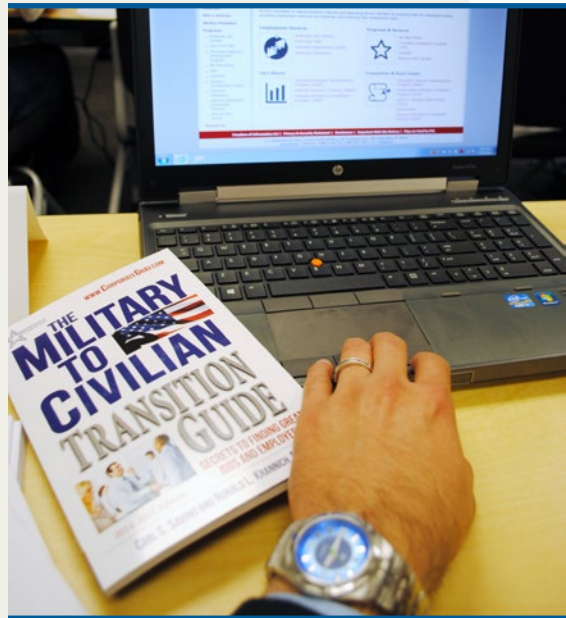

These homes are located at major military and VA medical centers nationwide, close to the medical center or hospital they serve. Fisher House Foundation also operates the Hero Miles program, using donated frequent flyer miles to bring family members to the bedside of injured service members as well as the Hotels for Heroes program, using donated hotel points to allow family members to stay at hotels near medical centers without charge. The foundation also manages a grant program that supports other military charities and scholarship funds for military children, spouses, and children of fallen and disabled veterans.
